QR Codes are a very quick way of linking to information like a website or on-line documents.

A QR code is a pattern of black and white squares that can be read by a smart phone.

Visitors can scan a QR code when they go to places on the NHS track and trace app.

You can download a QR scanner to your phone.

Or

You can use your phone's camera to read the QR code and then a web address link comes up on your phone screen.

Click on the web address to open the link.

The link will open on your phone.

Guidance

Coronavirus (COVID-19): providing unpaid care to adults with learning disabilities and autistic adults

Updated 30 July 2021

Department of Health & Social Care This guidance is for anyone who provides unpaid care, such as friends or family, to adults with learning disabilities and autistic adults.

The guidance will help people with caring responsibilities to:



- keep people with learning disabilities and autistic people safe
- support them to understand the changes they need to make during the COVID-19 outbreak
- protect their own wellbeing
